Chair's Comments

Chairwoman Kushner shared comments related to submitting the budget to the County Commissioners, being a part of the Brains and Bodies awards for AHA and Underwood Elementary being a Gold award winner, and thanking the Greater Raleigh Chamber of Commerce for sponsoring the Inter City Visit trip to Indianapolis, Indiana.

Superintendent's Comments

Dr. Merrill shared comments related to May 5th – May 9th being Teacher Appreciation Week; Dr. Merrill shared his immense gratitude for anyone who chooses public service as a career; naming the 2014 Teacher of the Year in ceremonies on May 8th at the Raleigh Convention Center; the recently completed Wake Up and Read Book Drive which was a huge success collecting over 67,000 new and gently used books for children ages birth through 12; and thanking those who assisted with raising money for the March of Dimes March for the Babies in Morrisville on April 26th.

Board Members' Comments

Board members shared comments related to the community reaching out to educators this week, visiting Hilburn Drive Academy where parents met to discuss concerns about the budget, the District 5 Board Advisory Council meeting and discussing student assignment and understanding the grading policy changes, visiting Holt Elementary School in Durham to see Arts in Action, recognizing Science Olympiad winners, recognizing Knightdale High School student Marquavious Johnson who was recognized as the NC Male Athlete of the Year, concern for the direction of public education and the alarming number of teachers not returning next year; hopeful that the County and State will recognize that this is a crisis situation, helping coordinate an Inter-City visit from Rochester, New York to Wake County; thanks were sent to Joyner Elementary, Garner High School, Ligon Middle School, Dr. Merrill, Cathy Moore, Marvin Connelly, Laura Evans, Tim Simmons, Rose Anne Gonzalez, and Tamani Anderson-Powell; the District 8 Board Advisory Council meeting and discussing the proposed budget and spending in public education; attending a

forum sponsored by Public Schools First North Carolina, participating in the Durham Kidznotes major fundraising event that occurred last week; recognizing the winners of the Laura Jane Parker Award; the Kenan Fellows Program being held at NC State this week, thanking nurses for all that they do during Nurse Recognition Week, thanking Drew Cook and Garner High School for hosting the visitors from Rochester, NY; and thanking teachers for planting seeds, inspiring , and for all that they do for the Wake County Public School System.

26. OFFER TO PURCHASE AND CONTRACT – WESTERN WAKE COUNTY (E-33)

Joe Desormeaux, Assistant Superintendent of Facilities shared the terms and conditions of an Offer to Purchase and Contract that was reached with Fifth Third Bank to acquire approximately 18.25 acres located between O'Kelly Chapel Road and Horton's Creek Road for a future elementary school site. The Property includes a portion of the parcel having Wake County PIN #0726716342. Fiscal Implications: Estimated land cost of \$2,900,000 would come from the Land Acquisition Component of Plan 2014 Funds. Recommendation for Action: Board approval is requested.

Kevin L. Hill made a motion to approve the Offer to Purchase and Contract – Western Wake County (E-33) subject to terms and conditions of the Board Real Estate Counsel. The motion was seconded by Bill Fletcher and unanimously approved.
