Outreach Strategy Goals

The outreach strategy is intended to ensure WCPSS is building relationships with its families, schools and partners; providing timely and accurate information; maintaining a clear and consistent message; and increasing awareness and visibility of the new choice student assignment plan that results in an action by the parent/guardian.

Primary Goals

1. Improve public awareness and understanding so that parents may make an informed choice

Establish Outreach Program to provide guidance and focus for outreach and communication efforts.

- Develop and enhance communication tools to reach the public
- Encourage face-to-face interactions with families & communities
- Create an educational outreach program, working across local agencies and WCPSS
 departments, including student support services; special education and preschool services;
 and academics, including magnet, AG, Title 1 and ESL programs
- 2. Increase collaboration and communication efforts that enable coordinated actions and communication synergies of WCPSS and community partners

Increase partnering activities with WCPSS and community partners to further stewardship.

- Develop outreach materials that convey a consistent image and "look" that is continually repeated and reinforced
- Form network of support and solicit new ways of collaborating in order to achieve mutual goals and objectives
- Share resources and exchange ideas

Tracking Outreach Activities & Outcomes

The Office of Family and Community Engagement (FACE) will account for outreach activities conducted on a routine basis. FACE will track data pertaining to the activity that identifies the type of communication tools used to achieve the goal, date of execution, message, desired outcome, targeted audience, allocated resources, associated department/organization, contact person and outcomes.

Sample of measurements tracked:

- # of info sessions / attendance numbers
- # of materials distributed
- # of website visitors (unique/returning), page views, time-on-site
- click-through rate
- media placements (articles, PSAs radio/tv, etc)
- # phone calls / form responses

Measurements assist the team in determining specific messages, clarifications or additional vehicles to reach various audiences. NC-WISE /selection tool response will also inform next step targeted efforts.

Communications Tools

A variety of tools have been created to support outreach efforts, both broad-reaching and targeted. Reports at key milestones will assist in determining which types of vehicles or key messages need to be further created or targeted to reach non-responsive groups.

Communities in Schools

CIS Wake serves more than 500 students at five after-school community-based learning centers and within six Wake County public school sites. Their academic coaches work within elementary, middle, and high school locations to assist administrators, teachers and educators in building a sustainable support network that leads to successful matriculation at each stage of a student's academic career.

- Flyers provided to 6 childhood development centers with total enrollment of 556 families with rising kindergarten students. 60-65% of these families qualify for social services voucher (i.e. proxy for FRPL qualification in WCPSS)
- Distributed over 50,000 flyers (English/Spanish)
 - Raleigh Housing Authority approximately 200 students in regular attendance
 - 22 childhood development centers of the Learning Care Group located across Wake County. Estimated reach 1,750-2,000 families with rising kindergarten students.
 - All-day distribution via retail outreach outside four Dollar General Stores (2-North Raleigh, 1-Cary, 1-South Raleigh) on Saturday, 12/17. Expected to reach material number of Spanish-language families based on conversations with store managers.








- Rising Kindergarten Pre-Enrollment by Node
