Vendors should show any required unit prices, but are requested also to offer a lump sum price where appropriate.

RFP EVALUATION: Proposals are requested for the services in the RFP. Wake County Public School System reserves the right to reject any proposal for any reason. Vendor(s) are cautioned that any/all information furnished or not furnished on this proposal may be used as a factor in determining the award of this contract.

<u>DEVIATIONS</u>: Any deviations from specifications and requirements herein must be clearly pointed out by vendor. Otherwise it will be considered that the services offered are in strict compliance with these specifications and requirements, and successful vendor will be held responsible therefor. Deviations must be explained in detail below or on an attached sheet. However, no implication is made by Wake County Public School System that deviations will be acceptable. Vendor is advised that the response (or lack thereof) on this question does not take precedence over specific responses or non-responses provided elsewhere in this RFP.

FIRM PROPOSAL: Prices and any other entry made hereon by the vendor shall be considered firm and not subject to change or withdrawal.

WCPSS Purchasing Department Ethics Policy and Standards of Conduct shall apply to this RFP.

confidentiality and prohibited communications during evaluation: During the proposal process from the date proposals are issued through the date the contract is awarded—each Vendor submitting a proposal (including its representatives, sub-contractors and/or suppliers) is prohibited from having any communications with any Wake County Board of Education member, any employee of WCPSS, or any other person in any way involved in the award of this contract, if the communication refers to the content of Vendor's proposal or qualifications, the contents of another Vendor's proposal, another Vendor's qualifications or ability to perform the contract, and/or the transmittal of any other communication of information that could be

reasonably considered to have the effect of directly or indirectly influencing the evaluation of proposals and/or the award of the contract. A Vendor not in compliance with this provision shall be disqualified from contract award. A Vendor's proposal may be disqualified if its sub-contractor and supplier engage in any of the foregoing communications during the time that the procurement is active (i.e., the issuance date of the procurement to the date of contract award). Only those discussions, communications or transmittals of information authorized or initiated by WCPSS for this RFP or general inquiries directed to the purchaser regarding requirements of the RFP (prior to proposal submission) or the status of the contract award (after submission) are excepted from this provision. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. READ, REVIEW AND COMPLY: It shall be the vendor's responsibility to read this entire document, review all enclosures and attachments, and comply with all requirements specified herein. Vendor shall review WCPSS's Purchasing Department Ethics Policy and Standards of Conduct and shall refrain from any actions that would cause an employee to be in violation of the policies.
- 2. NOTICE TO VENDORS: All proposals are subject to the provisions of special terms and conditions specific to this RFP, the specifications. Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) objects to and will not evaluate or consider any additional terms and conditions submitted with a vendor's response. This applies to any language appearing in or attached to the document as part of the vendor's response. DO NOT ATTACH ANY ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS. By execution and delivery of this document, the vendor agrees that any additional terms and conditions, whether submitted purposely or inadvertently, shall have no force or effect.
- 3. EXECUTION: Failure to sign under EXECUTION section will render proposal invalid.
- 4. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE: In cases of conflict between specific provisions in this RFP, the order of precedence shall be (1) special terms and conditions specific to this RFP, (2) specifications, and (3) Instructions to Vendors.
- 5. TIME FOR CONSIDERATION: Unless otherwise indicated on the first page of this document, vendor's proposal shall be valid for 45 days from the date of proposal opening. Preference may be given to responses allowing not less than 45 days for consideration and acceptance.
- 6. SPECIFICATIONS: Any deviation from specifications indicated herein must be clearly pointed out; otherwise, it will be considered that items offered are in strict compliance with these specifications, and vendor will be held responsible therefore. Deviations shall be explained in detail. The vendor shall not construe this paragraph as inviting deviation or implying that any deviation will be acceptable.
- 7. CLARIFICATIONS/INTERPRETATIONS: Any and all questions regarding this document must be addressed to the WCPSS representative named on the cover sheet of this document. Do not contact the school or department directly. Any and all revisions to this document shall be made only by written addendum from WCPSS Purchasing Department. The vendor is cautioned that the requirements of this RFP can be altered only by written addendum and that verbal communications from whatever source are of no effect.
- 8. ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION: WCPSS reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive any informality in proposals and, unless otherwise specified by the vendor, to accept any item in the proposal.
- 9. AWARD OF CONTRACT: Qualified proposals will be evaluated and acceptance may be made to the proposal most advantageous to WCPSS as determined upon consideration of such factors as: prices offered; the quality of the services offered; the general reputation and performance capabilities of the vendors; the substantial conformity with the specifications and other conditions set forth in the RFP; the suitability of the services; the date or dates of delivery and performance; and such other factors deemed by WCPSS to be pertinent or peculiar to the services in question. WCPSS also reserves the right to reject any and all proposals
- 10. HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES: Pursuant to General Statute 143-48 and Executive Order #150, WCPSS invites and encourages participation in this procurement process by businesses owned by minorities, women, disabled, disabled business enterprises and non-profit work centers for the blind and severely disabled.
- 11. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION: As provided by statute and rule, WCPSS will consider keeping trade secrets which the vendor does not wish disclosed confidential. Each page shall be identified in boldface at the top and bottom as "CONFIDENTIAL" by the vendor. Cost information shall not be deemed confidential. In spite of what is labeled as a trade secret, the determination whether it is or not will be determined by North Carolina law.
- 12. AWARD PROCEDURES: Contract award notice shall be posted on WCPSS website. Contract award notices are sent only to those actually awarded contracts, and not to every person or firm responding to this solicitation.
- 13. RECIPROCAL PREFERENCE: G.S. 143-59 establishes a reciprocal preference law to discourage other states from applying in-state preferences against North Carolina's resident vendors. The "Principal Place of Business" is defined as the principal place from which the trade or business of the vendor is directed or managed.
- 14. DEFAULT AND PERFORMANCE BOND: In case of default by the vendor, WCPSS may procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the vendor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby. WCPSS reserves the right to require performance bond or other acceptable alternative guarantees from successful vendor without expense to WCPSS.
- 15. GOVERNMENTAL RESTRICTIONS: In the event any Governmental restrictions are imposed which necessitate alteration of the services prior to their delivery, it shall be the responsibility of the vendor to notify in writing WCPSS, indicating the specific regulation which required such alterations. WCPSS reserves the right to accept any such alterations, including any price adjustments occasioned thereby, or to cancel the contract.
- 16. TAXES: Any applicable taxes shall be invoiced as a separate item.

- 17. SITUS: The place of this contract, its situs and forum, shall be Wake County, North Carolina, where all matters, whether sounding in contract or tort, relating to its validity, construction, interpretation and enforcement shall be determined.
- 18. GOVERNING LAWS: This contract is made under and shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of North Carolina.
- 19. INSPECTION AT VENDOR'S SITE: WCPSS reserves the right to inspect, at a reasonable time, the equipment, plant or other facilities of a prospective vendor prior to contract award, and during the contract term as necessary for WCPSS determination that such services conform with the specifications/requirements and are adequate and suitable for the proper and effective performance of the contract.
- 20. PAYMENT TERMS: Payment terms are Net not later than 30 days after receipt of correct invoice or acceptance of goods, whichever is later. Payment may be made by procurement card and it shall be accepted by the vendor for payment if the vendor accepts that card (Visa, Mastercard, etc.) from other customers.
- 21. PATENT: The vendor shall hold and save WCPSS, its officers, agents and employees, harmless from liability of any kind, including costs and expenses, on account of any confidential information, copyrighted material, patented or unpatented invention, articles, device or appliance manufactured or used in the performance of this contract, including use by WCPSS or disclosure of any information pursuant to the NC Public Records Act.
- 22. ASSIGNMENT: No assignment of the vendor's obligations nor the vendor's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the purchasing department and solely as a convenience to the vendor, WCPSS may: a. Forward the vendor's payment check directly to any person or entity designated by the vendor, and b. Include any person or entity designated by vendor as a joint payee on the vendor's payment check. In no event shall such approval and action obligate WCPSS to anyone other than the vendor and the vendor shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all contract obligations.

23. INSURANCE:

a. Worker's Compensation including Occupational Disease and Employer's Liability Insurance. Statutory - Amount and coverage as required by state of North Carolina Worker's Compensation laws. Employer's Liability - At least

- c. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance, including coverage for owned, hired and non-owned vehicles: A Combined Single Limit for bodily injury and property damage limit of not less than \$1,000,000; and \$2,000 medical payments.
- d. Certificates of Insurance acceptable to WCPSS shall be filed with WCPSS prior to commencement of the Work. These Certificates shall contain a provision that coverage afforded under the policies will not be canceled until at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to WCPSS, and that the Wake County Board of Education is listed as additional insured on general liability.

The successful vendor agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Wake County Board of Education (WCBOE) for any liability that may arise from the negligent or illegal acts of the vendor's employees or agents.

- 24. GENERAL INDEMNITY: The vendor shall hold and save WCPSS, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from liability of any kind, including all claims and losses, accruing or resulting to any other person, firm, or corporation furnishing or supplying work, services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this contract, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm, or corporation that may be injured or damaged by the vendor in the performance of this contract and that are attributable to the negligence or intentionally tortious acts of the vendor. The vendor represents and warrants that it shall make no claim of any kind or nature against WCPSS agents who are involved in the project. This section shall survive the termination or expiration of this contract.
- 25. LUNSFORD ACT/CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS: The Vendor shall conduct at its own expense sexual offender registry checks on each of its employees, agents, ownership personnel, or contractors ("contractual personnel") who will engage in any service on or delivery of goods to school system property or at a school-system sponsored event. The checks shall include at a minimum checks of the state Sex Offender and Public Protection Registration Program, the state Sexually Violent Predator Registration Program, and the National Sex Offender Registry ("the Registries"). For the Vendor's convenience only, all of the required registry checks may be completed at no cost by accessing the North Carolina Sex Offender Registry website at http://sexoffender.ncdoj.gov/. The Vendor shall provide certification on Sexual Offender Registry Check Certification Form that the registry checks were conducted on each of its contractual personnel providing services or delivering goods under this Agreement prior to the commencement of such services or the delivery of such goods. The Vendor shall conduct a current initial check of the registries (a check done more than 30 days prior to the date of this Agreement shall not satisfy this contractual obligation). In addition, Vendor agrees to conduct the registry checks and provide a supplemental certification form before any additional contractual personnel are used to deliver goods or provide services pursuant to this Agreement. Vendor further agrees to conduct annual registry checks of all contractual personnel and provide annual certifications at each anniversary date of this Agreement. Vendor shall not assign any individual to deliver goods or provide services pursuant to this Agreement if said individual appears on any of the listed registries. Vendor agrees that it will maintain all records and documents necessary to demonstrate that it has conducted a thorough check of the registries as to each contractual personnel, and agrees to provide such records and documents to the school system upon request. Vendor specifically acknowledges that the school system retains the right to audit these records to ensure compliance with this section at any time in the school system's sole discretion. Failure to comply with the terms of this provision shall be grounds for immediate termination of the Agreement. In addition, the school system may conduct additional criminal records checks at Vendor's expense. If the school system exercises this right to conduct additional criminal records checks, Vendor agrees to provide within seven (7) days of request the full name, date of birth, state of residency for the past ten years, and any additional information requested by the school system for all contractual personnel who may deliver goods or perform services under this Agreement. Vendor further agrees that it has an ongoing obligation to provide the school system with the name of any new contractual personnel who may deliver goods or provide

services under the Agreement. WCPSS reserves the right to prohibit any contractual personnel of Vendor from delivering goods or providing services under this Agreement if WCPSS determines, in its sole discretion, that such contractual personnel may pose a threat to the safety or well-being of students, school personnel or others.

- 26. ACCESS TO PERSONS AND RECORDS: WCPSS and its internal auditors shall have access to persons and records as a result of this contract. Vendor shall provide reasonable access to all documents, invoices, pay records and other materials involved in this contract.
- 27. COMPLIANCE WITH E-VERIFY: Vendor shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations in providing services under this Contract. In particular, Vendor shall not employ any individuals to provide services to the School System who are not authorized by federal law to work in the United States. Vendor also represents that as of the date of this Contract, Vendor is not included on the list of restricted companies determined to be engaged in a boycott of Israel created by the North Carolina State Treasurer pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 147-86.81.
- 30. <u>Termination for Default</u>. At any time, the School System may terminate this Contract immediately and without prior notice if Vendor is unable to meet goals and timetables or if the School System is dissatisfied with the quality of services provided. The Vendor shall reimburse the School System for any for any costs and expenses incurred by the School System resulting from the Vendor's default. In the event of a termination pursuant to this section, the school system reserves its rights to pursue all remedies to which it may be entitled at law or in equity.
- 31. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. The School System may terminate this Contract at any time at its complete discretion upon twenty (20) calendar days' notice in writing from the School System to Vendor prior to the date of termination. In addition, all finished or unfinished documents and other materials produced by Vendor pursuant to this Contract shall, at the request of the School System be turned over to it and become its property. If the Contract is terminated by the School System in accordance with this section, the School System will pay Vendor for all services performed and accepted as of the date of termination.

WCPSS Purchasing Department Ethics Policy and Standards of Conduct

Approved extended employment shall not be a violation of this.

 - j. Shop Drawings: Include plans, elevations, sections, details, and attachments to other work.
 - k. Detail equipment assemblies and indicate dimensions, weights, load distribution, required clearances, method of field assembly, components, and location and size of each field connection.
 - I. Wiring Diagrams: For power, signal, and control wiring.
- 2. Warranty: Sample of special warranty.

B. Close-Out Submittals:

1. Operation and Maintenance Data: For each chiller to include in emergency, operation, and maintenance manuals.

1.3. EXTRA MATERIALS

- A. Extra Stock: Provide owner with the following extra materials:
 - 1. Quart container of paint used in application of topcoat to use in touchup applications.

1.4. QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. ARI Certification: Certify chiller according to AHRI 590 certification program(s).
- B. ASME Compliance: Fabricate and label chiller to comply with ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code: Section VIII, Division 1, and include an ASME U-stamp and nameplate certifying compliance.
- C. Efficiencies shall comply with the State Energy Conservation Code.
- D. Electrical Components, Devices and Accessories: UL listed and labeled as defined by NFPA 70, the National Electric Code, or equivalent by a qualified testing agency marked for the intended location and application and accepted by the Authority Having Jurisdiction and Engineer.
- E. Mechanical Equipment and Materials: UL listed and labeled as defined by State Building Codes or equivalent by a qualified testing agency marked for the intended location and application and accepted by the Authority Having Jurisdiction and Engineer.
- F. Testing and listing laboratories of mechanical and electrical equipment shall be accredited by the North Carolina Building Code Council (NCBCC).

1.5. DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND HANDLING

- A. Ship each chiller with a full charge of refrigerant. Charge each chiller with nitrogen if refrigerant is shipped in containers separate from chiller.
- B. Ship each oil-lubricated chiller with a full charge of oil.

1.6. COORDINATION

A. Coordinate sizes and locations of concrete bases with actual equipment provided. Cast anchor-bolt inserts into bases.

1.7. WARRANTY

A. Special Warranty: Manufacturer's complete machine parts, labor and refrigerant warranty for 5-years from the date of Owner Acceptance.

PART 2 - PRODUCTS

2.1. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. Manufacturers: Subject to compliance with requirements, provide products by one of the following for screw-type compressor chillers:
 - 1. Carrier (30XA Series)
 - 2. Dunham Bush (AVX-A Series)
 - Johnson Controls/York (YV/YC Series)
 - 4. Trane (ACR Series)

2.2. PACKAGED, AIR-COOLED CHILLERS

- A. Description: Factory-assembled and run-tested chiller complete with base and frame, condenser casing, compressors, compressor motors and motor controllers, evaporator, condenser coils, condenser fans and motors, electrical power, controls, and accessories.
- B. Cabinet: Chiller cabinet shall be manufacturer's standard galvanized steel construction with corrosion protection coating and exterior finish.
- C. Enhanced Sound-Reduction: Factory-provided package designed to reduce sound level without affecting performance.

2.3. CHILLERS WITH ROTARY SCREW COMPRESSORS

A. Compressors: Positive displacement, direct-drive, semi-hermetic compressors with precision-machined cast-iron casing and manufacturer's standard single or dual rotor design. Each compressor shall be equipped with suction and discharge service valves, crankcase oil heater and suction strainer.

B. Capacity Control:

- Constant-Speed Compressors: On-off compressor cycling and modulating slidevalve assembly or port unloaders combined with hot-gas bypass, if necessary, to achieve performance indicated. Maintain stable operation throughout range of operation. Configure to achieve most energy-efficient operation possible.
- Variable-Speed Compressors: Variable speed compressor control that does not require a slide-valve or capacity control valves to modulate capacity. Maintain stable operation throughout range of operation. Configure to achieve most energy-efficient operation possible.
- 3. Operating Range: From 100 to 15 percent of design capacity.
- 4. Condenser-Air Unloading Requirements over Operating Range: Drop-in entering condenser-air temperature of 5 deg F drop for each 10 percent in capacity reduction.

- C. Oil Lubrication System: Consisting of pump if required, filtration, heater, cooler, factory-wired power connection, and controls. Provide lubrication to bearings, gears, and other rotating surfaces at all operating, startup, shutdown, and standby conditions including power failure. Provide thermostatically controlled oil heater properly sized to remove refrigerant from oil; factory-installed and pressure-tested piping with isolation valves and accessories; oil compatible with refrigerant and chiller components; and positive visual indication of oil level.
- D. Vibration Control: Balance chiller compressors and drive assemblies to provide a precision balance that is free of noticeable vibration over the entire operating range. Mount individual compressors on vibration isolators.
- E. Compressor Motors: High-torque, induction type motors with inherent thermaloverload protection on each phase and hermetically sealed and cooled by refrigerant suction gas.
- F. Compressor Motor Controllers: Wye-Delta, reduced-voltage controller: NEMA ICS 2, closed transition.
- G. Refrigerant Circuits:
 - 1. Refrigerant: R-134A
 - Refrigerant Compatibility: Chiller parts exposed to refrigerants shall be fully compatible with refrigerants, and pressure components shall be rated for refrigerant pressures.
 - Refrigerant Circuit: Each shall include a thermal- or electronic-expansion valve, refrigerant charging connections, a hot-gas muffler, compressor suction and discharge shutoff valves, a liquid-line shutoff valve, a replaceable-core filterdryer, a sight glass with moisture indicator, a liquid-line solenoid valve, and an insulated suction line.
 - Pressure Relief Device: ASME-rated, spring-loaded, single- or multiple-reseating type pressure relief valve that complies with requirements in ASHRAE 15 and in applicable portions of ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code: Section VIII, Division 1.

H. Evaporator:

- 1. Description: Shell-and-tube design. Tested and stamped according to ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code: Section VIII, Division 1.
- 2. Shell Material: Carbon steel.
- 3. Shell Heads: Removable carbon-steel heads located at each end of the tube bundle.
- 4. Fluid Nozzles: Terminated with flanged end connections for connection to field piping.
- 5. Tube Construction: Individually replaceable copper tubes with enhanced fin design, expanded into tube sheets.

- 6. Heater: Factory-installed heater with integral controls designed to protect the evaporator to 0 deg F.
- I. Air-Cooled Condenser: Plate-fin coil with integral sub-cooling on each circuit, rated at 450 psig. Coils shall be constructed of copper tubes mechanically bonded to aluminum fins.
 - 1. Fans: Direct-drive propeller type with statically and dynamically balanced fan blades, arranged for vertical air discharge.
 - Fan Motors: Totally enclosed non-ventilating (TENV) or totally enclosed air over (TEAO) enclosure, with permanently lubricated bearings. Equip each motor with overload protection integral to either the motor or chiller controls.
 - 3. Fan Guards: Steel safety guards with corrosion-resistant coating.
 - 4. Hail Protection: Provide condenser coils with louvers, baffles, or hoods to protect against hail damage.
- J. Electrical Power: Factory-installed and -wired switches, motor controllers, transformers, and other electrical devices necessary shall provide a single-point field-power connection to chiller. House in a unit-mounted, NEMA 250, Type 3R enclosure with hinged access door with lock and key or padlock and key. Install factory wiring outside of an enclosure in a raceway.
 - 1. Disconnecting Means: Field-power interface shall be to a NEMA AB 1, instantaneous-trip circuit breaker with lockable handle. Disconnect means shall be interlocked with door operation. Minimum withstand rating shall be as required by electrical power distribution system, but not less than 65,000 A.
 - 2. Branch power circuit to each motor and to controls with fused disconnect switch or field-adjustable short-circuit trip set point circuit breaker.
 - 3. Provide each motor with overcurrent protection.
 - 4. Overload relay sized according to UL 1995 or an integral component of chiller control microprocessor.
 - 5. Phase-Failure and Undervoltage Relays: Solid-state sensing with adjustable settings.
 - Control Transformer: Unit-mounted transformer with primary and secondary fuses and sized with enough capacity to operate electrical load plus spare capacity. Power unit-mounted controls where indicated.
 - 7. Control Relays: Auxiliary and adjustable time-delay relays.
 - 8. For chiller electrical power supply, indicate the following:
 - a. Current and phase to phase for all three phases.
 - b. Voltage, phase to phase, and phase to neutral for all three phases.
 - c. Three-phase real power (kilowatts).

- d. Three-phase reactive power (kilovolt amperes reactive).
- e. Power factor.
- f. Running log of total power versus time (kilowatt-hours).
- g. Fault log, with time and date of each.
- K. Control: Standalone and microprocessor based, with all memory stored in nonvolatile memory so that reprogramming is not required on loss of electrical power.
 - 1. Enclosure: Unit mounted, NEMA 250, Type 4, hinged or lockable; factory wired with a single-point, field-power connection and a separate control circuit.
 - 2. Operator Interface: Multiple-character digital or graphic display with dynamic update of information and with keypad or touch-sensitive display located on front of control enclosure. In imperial units selectable through the interface, display the following information:
 - a. Date and time.
 - b. Operating or alarm status.
 - c. Operating hours.
 - d. Outdoor-air temperature if required for chilled-water reset.
 - e. Temperature and pressure of operating set points.
 - Entering and leaving temperatures of chilled water.
 - Refrigerant pressures in evaporator and condenser.
 - h. Saturation temperature in evaporator and condenser.
 - i. No cooling load condition.
 - j. Elapsed time meter (compressor run status).
 - k. Pump status.
 - Anti-recycling timer status.
 - m. Percent of maximum motor amperage.
 - n. Current-limit set point.
 - o. Number of compressor starts.
 - 3. Control Functions:
 - a. Manual or automatic startup and shutdown time schedule.
 - Entering and leaving chilled-water temperatures, control set points, and motor load limits. Chilled-water leaving temperature shall be reset based on outdoor air temperature.

- c. Current limit and demand limit.
- d. External chiller emergency stop.
- e. Anti-recycling timer.
- f. Automatic lead-lag switching.
- g. Variable evaporator flow.
- h. Thermal storage.
- 4. Manually Reset Safety Controls: The following conditions shall shut down chiller and require manual reset:
 - a. Low evaporator pressure or high condenser pressure.
 - b. Low chilled-water temperature.
 - c. Refrigerant high pressure.
 - d. High or low oil pressure.
 - e. High oil temperature.
 - f. Loss of chilled-water flow.
 - g. Control device failure.
- 5. Trending: Capability to trend analog data of up to five parameters simultaneously over an adjustable period and frequency of polling.
- Security Access: Provide electronic security access to controls through identification and password with at least three levels of access: view only; view and operate; and view, operate, and service.
- 7. Control Authority: At least four conditions: Off, local manual control at chiller, local automatic control at chiller, and automatic control through a remote source.
- 8. BAS Interface: Factory-installed hardware and software to enable the BAS to monitor, control, and display chiller status and alarms.
 - a. BACnet per ASHRAE 135 communication interface with the BAS shall enable the BAS operator to remotely control and monitor the chiller from an operator workstation. All control features and monitoring points displayed locally at chiller control panel shall be available through the BAS.
- L. Insulation: Factory-applied closed-cell flexible elastomeric insulation, 3/4-inch minimum thickness, complying with Section 230719 over all cold surfaces of chiller capable of forming condensation. Seal all seams and joints to provide a vapor barrier. Paint exposed surfaces of insulation to match other painted parts.
- M. Accessories:
 - 1. Factory-furnished, chilled-water flow switches for field installation.

2. Individual compressor suction and discharge pressure gages with shutoff valves for each refrigerant circuit.

2.4. SOUND REDUCTION FEATURES

- A. Sound Reduction Features: Provide factory installed accessories from the chiller manufacturer designed to reduce noise from the standard product.
 - 1. Low Noise Condenser Fans
 - 2. Compressor Sound Enclosure
 - Enclosures must be easily removed and re-installed without special tools for compressor inspection and maintenance. Field-fabricated enclosures are not acceptable.

2.5. SOURCE QUALITY CONTROL

- A. Perform functional tests of chillers before shipping.
- B. Factory run test each air-cooled chiller with water flowing through evaporator.
- C. Factory test and inspect evaporator and condenser according to ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code: Section VIII, Division 1.
- D. For chillers located outdoors, rate sound power level according to ARI 370.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.1. EXAMINATION

- A. Examine chillers before installation. Reject chillers that are damaged.
- B. Examine roughing-in for equipment support, anchor-bolt sizes and locations, piping, and electrical connections to verify actual locations, sizes, and other conditions affecting chiller performance, maintenance, and operations before equipment installation.
 - 1. Final chiller locations indicated on Drawings are approximate. Determine exact locations before roughing-in for piping and electrical connections.
- Proceed with installation only after unsatisfactory conditions have been corrected.

3.2. CHILLER INSTALLATION

- A. Equipment Mounting:
 - 1. Install chillers on cast-in-place concrete equipment bases. Comply with requirements for equipment bases and foundations.

- B. Maintain manufacturer's recommended clearances for service and maintenance.
- C. Charge chiller with refrigerant and fill with oil if not factory installed.
- D. Install separate devices furnished by manufacturer and not factory installed.

3.3. CONNECTIONS

- A. Comply with requirements for piping specified in Section 232113 and 232116. Drawings indicate general arrangement of piping, fittings, and specialties.
- B. Install piping adjacent to chiller to allow service and maintenance.
- C. Evaporator Fluid Connections: Connect to evaporator inlet with shutoff valve, strainer, flexible connector, thermometer, and plugged tee with pressure gage. Connect to evaporator outlet with shutoff valve, flexible connector, flow switch, thermometer, plugged tee with shutoff valve and pressure gage, and drain connection with valve. Make connections to chiller with a flange.

3.4. STARTUP SERVICE

- A. Engage a factory-authorized service representative to perform startup service.
 - Complete installation and startup checks according to manufacturer's written instructions.
 - Verify that refrigerant charge is sufficient and chiller has been leak tested.
 - 3. Verify that pumps are installed and functional.
 - 4. Verify that thermometers and gages are installed.
 - 5. Operate chiller for run-in period.
 - 6. Check bearing lubrication and oil levels.
 - 7. Verify proper motor rotation.
 - 8. Verify static deflection of vibration isolators, including deflection during chiller startup and shutdown.
 - 9. Verify and record performance of fluid flow and low-temperature interlocks for evaporator.
 - 10. Verify and record performance of chiller protection devices.
 - Test and adjust controls and safeties. Replace damaged or malfunctioning controls and equipment.
- B. Inspect field-assembled components, equipment installation, and piping and electrical connections for proper assembly, installation, and connection.
- C. Prepare test and inspection startup reports.

3.5. DEMONSTRATION

A. Engage a factory-authorized service representative to train Owner's maintenance personnel to adjust, operate, and maintain chillers.
