

SUMMARY OF GRADUATE INTENTIONS: 2002-03

Overview: Wake County Public Schools graduated 5,680 seniors from 15 high schools and two alternative schools in the 2002-03 school year. This constitutes a 5.10% increase from the 2001-02 school year. 86% of the 2002-03 graduating seniors intended to continue their education after graduation, with 61% planning to attend a 4-year college.

Near the end of each school year, high school seniors complete a Graduating Seniors Intention Survey that serves multiple purposes: it reveals the immediate intentions of each graduating senior; it specifies a select college to receive final transcripts; and it provides a forwarding address for possible follow-up surveys. Using these surveys, guidance counselors and principals complete a composite report of the postgraduate intentions of all students receiving diplomas at any time during the current school year. The required report summarizes intentions by ethnicity and gender. The Evaluation and Research Department (E&R) then compiles the individual school reports and transmits them to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction. This report is a brief summary of the information for graduates in the 2002-03 school year.

The survey asks students to indicate whether they plan to:

- enroll in four-year institutions (broken down by public or private) and whether or not their intended college is in or out of North Carolina;
- enroll in two-year community, technical, or junior colleges (broken down by public or private) and whether or not their intended college is in or out of North Carolina;
- enroll in trade, business, or nursing schools;
- enlist in military service;
- seek employment;
- do something other than the items listed above.

For summary purposes, all four-year institutions are combined, and all two-year institutions are often combined in this report. Attachment 1 is a one-sheet summary of Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) graduate intentions for 2002-03. Attachment 2 contains disaggregated data by school for all postgraduate categories. Attachment 3 contains a comparison of graduate intentions data by school over a five-year period. Attachment 4 is a sample of the Graduating Seniors Intention Survey.

WAKE COUNTY
PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM

Of the total number of graduating students in Wake County, 49% were males and 51% were females. The following figure shows the distribution of males and females in the prescribed postgraduate categories. More females than males planned to attend four-year colleges, and more females than males intended to continue with some form of schooling. About 6% of females and 9% of males intended to enter the military or get a full-time job. Results by gender are nearly the same as for 2000-01 and 2001-02 graduates.

The next table illustrates the breakdown by subgroups designated in federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation. By ethnicity, the group with the highest percentage of students planning to attend a four-year college was Asian at 78.0%; Hispanic/Latino graduates had the lowest percentage at 34.3% (which is down 10 percentage points from the previous year). Hispanic/Latino and Black graduates had the highest percentage of students planning to get a full-time job (11.4% and 7.3% respectively) while Asian graduates had the lowest percentage at 1.2%.

Note: The numbers for Free or Reduced-price Lunch (FRL) and Limited English Proficiency (LEP) categories were taken from individual survey forms and student databases, not from reports submitted by schools.

Statewide data was not available for 2002-03 at the time of publication of this report. However, Figure 3 compares Wake County graduating students to all graduating students in North Carolina for the last two years for which data is available. WCPSS had a *higher* percentage of American Indian, Black, and White students planning to attend four-year institutions. While 64% of White students in Wake County planned to attend four-year colleges in 2002-03, only 44% of all North Carolina White students in 2001-02 had those aspirations, a 20-point difference. About 51% of Black graduates in Wake County planned to attend four-year colleges, compared to 46% of all North Carolina Black graduates.

WCPSS had a lower percentage of both Black and White students planning to get a full-time job – about 4% of White WCPSS students compared to 12% of North Carolina White students, and about 7% of Black WCPSS students compared to 12% statewide.

Figure 4 shows a breakdown of graduating seniors by ethnicity for each WCPSS high school. The 2002-03 graduating class size of the comprehensive high schools ranged from 217 students at Wake Forest to 499 students at Enloe. The average graduating class from a WCPSS high school in 2002-03 was 373 students. (Note: Longview and Phillips are alternative schools with specialized programs and do not offer a comprehensive curriculum.)

A closer look is given to the graduate intentions of seniors by school in Figure 5. The percentage of graduating students at a comprehensive high school planning to attend four-year colleges ranged from 41% to 75%. Broughton, Enloe, and Green Hope High Schools each had 75% of their students planning to attend four-year institutions.

The percentage of graduating students planning to further their educational pursuits through four-year colleges, two-year colleges, or trade/business schools ranged from 71% to 93%.

Athens Drive had the highest percentage of seniors (93% - up four points from last year) planning to continue their education, either through four-year colleges, two-year colleges, or trade/business

schools. Other schools with more than 90% of graduates planning to continue their education include Apex, Broughton, Green Hope, and Leesville Road.

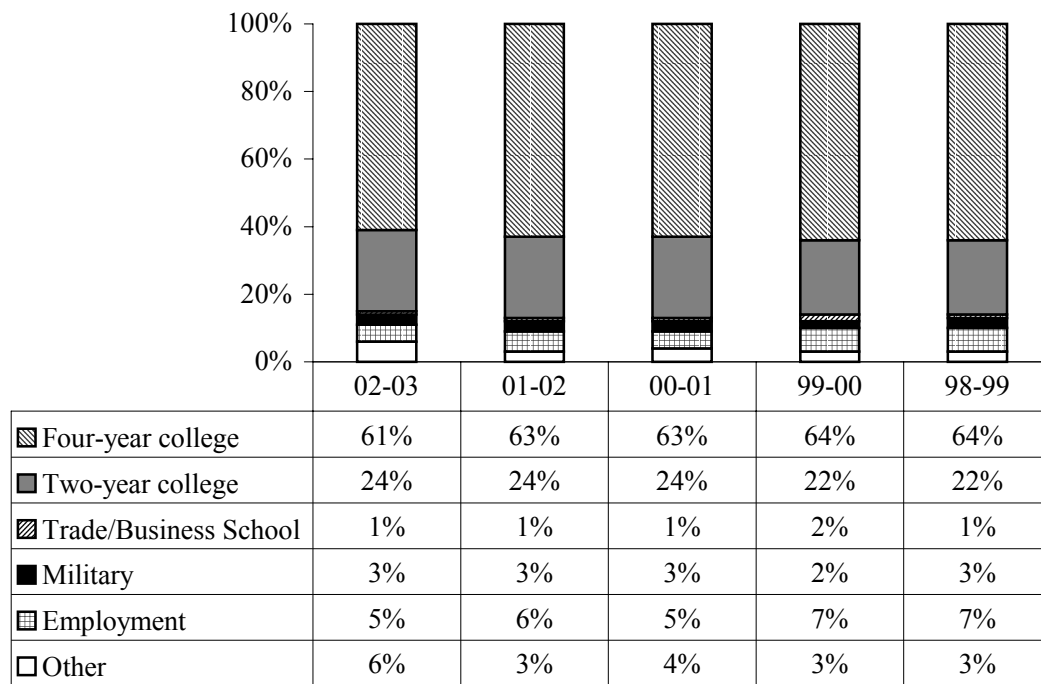
Fuquay-Varina had the highest percentage of seniors (6%) planning to enter the military. East Wake had the highest percentage of seniors (11%) planning to seek employment. Schools that had the highest percentage of students with intentions other than college or trade school were Wakefield (29%), Fuquay-Varina (19%), Garner (18%), East Wake (16%), and Enloe (16%).

Figure 6 shows that there has been little change in graduate intentions over time. However, there has been a slight gradual decrease in students planning to attend four-year colleges (64% from 1998-99 to 1999-2000; 63% from 2000-01 to 2001-02; and now 61% in 2002-03).

While the districtwide percentage of graduates planning to attend four-year colleges slightly declined during the past four years, six schools showed noticeable changes from 2002 to 2003. The four-year college percentage for Green Hope increased four percentage points, from 71% in 2002 to 75% in 2003. However, Cary decreased twelve points (from 65% down to 53%), Wake Forest-Rolesville decreased eleven points (from 61% to 50%), Wakefield decreased nine points (from 58% to 49%), Fuquay-Varina decreased seven points (from 52% to 45%), and Apex dropped five points (from 68% to 63%).

Districtwide percentages of graduates planning to seek employment remained relatively stable. Changes in the percentages of graduates planning to seek employment were larger for four high schools. Fuquay-Varina's percentage of students planning on employment dropped seven percentage points (from 9% down to 2%), however, that many more seniors claimed their postgraduate plans to be "other." Southeast Raleigh dropped 11 points (from 15% down to a current 4%), Millbrook and Athens Drive dropped seven points (from 10% down to 3%).
